- Trail End Museum Bird Walk for children led by Pam Moore

- Wagon Box Monument bird, plant, history hike led by Jackie, Janell and Phil Gonzales, and historian Bob Wilson
- 9 Mountain Bluebird boxes were placed on private land near Red Grade Road to celebrate the life of Dave Polefka
- Continued production of our email-newsletter
- Time and effort along with contributions to Buffalo's Clear Creek Trail wetland restoration project led by Phil Gonzales
- Talk to Ranchester City Council about voles and wetlands by Jackie
